TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT COURSES FOR YOU AND YOUR MEMBERS

Branch Education Co-Ordinators (BECs) Training

Branch Education Co-Ordinators play a pivotal role in members involved in the branch through learning opportunities and getting new reps trained and confident to get started. This course will help you to identify the training needs of activists and co-ordinate support for new reps to get started in their role. It will familiarise you with UNISON's learning opportunities and the organising potential of empowering members through learning. It also covers contributing to annual branch assessment by developing an annual training plan. Most regions offer training for BECs as part of the Branch Officer Training weekend – see your regional programme for dates and details.

Employment Law courses

Dealing with Privatisation & TUPE courses

These two courses (Privatisation is one day and TUPE is half a day) are available to your branch. If you have a number of reps that need this training please contact your regional education officer to ask for a course to be arranged locally.

UNISON Organising Steward – Online Courses

This course is for UNISON stewards who are unable to attend one of our face-to-face Organising Steward courses (because of work pattern, domestic commitments, etc.). The course will run:

• 25 September -11 November 2017 (closing date 15 September)

The course uses the same high quality materials, the same tutor support, the same networking with other UNISON stewards, but on-line from your workplace or local/employer learning centre. It is delivered in a friendly, encouraging way by expert tutors. You access the course via the internet and work interactively on tasks with other course participants. You will need to spend 3-4 hours a week over a 7-week period. In terms of IT skills, the starting point for taking part in this online course is the ability to send an email and know how to access the internet.

Branch Education Co-Ordinators Starter Pack


